John's Jottings

Unity

My great-great-grandfather, Willis Simeon Bowles, served in the Confederate Army during the Civil War. He was in Joseph Johnston's Army fighting in the Carolinas. After receiving word of Lee's surrender at Appomattox, Johnston began negotiating the surrender of his Army with General Sherman. Johnston and Sherman met at Bennet's Farm four miles outside Durham Station, N.C. (present-day Durham). On April 26, the surrender was finalized, ending the hostilities in the East. Willis began the trek home to Baconton, GA., refusing the train. The story of Willis walking home after the war became one of our family legends.

When Kay worked at Lexington Mental Health Center, she was chosen to be trained in Parent-Child Interaction Therapy. This training required her to go to Duke University several times. I went with her on one of her trips to Durham.

While Kay was in her training session, I went to the site of Bennet's Farm, which is now a National Historic site. I went to commune with my great-great-grandfather and experienced an idea of what he saw and felt that April. The most powerful part of that experience was the monument marking the surrender spot. It did not depict Confederate soldiers surrendering to Union soldiers as one might expect. The monument was two marble columns with a marble crosspiece at the top. On the crosspiece was a single word: UNITY.

The place where the most divisive chapter in our country's history ended was marked by that single word: UNITY. This war where brother fought against brother, ended with a call for unity. Armies that had fought for four long, horrible years across Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi, Georgia, and the Carolinas called for unity. This monument cried for soldiers who had been trying to kill each other to come together in peace as brothers. The monument said, "Put aside your differences, let go of your causes, and live in peace."

Unity was the only way the country could heal after those horrific years. Holding on to lost causes, resentment, anger, and difference would only continue the conflict. Only by forgiving and uniting could the country heal. Even now, over 150 years later, we have not completely healed. We still hold onto some of those differences and old opinions.

Unity is necessary for a community to survive. Working together in a united mission leads to a thriving community. Any division will lead to the end of the community. Since the church is a community, these rules apply. Being united in mission will lead to a thriving church. Divisions will lead to the end of a church.

I know we all love Trinity and want her to thrive. Sadly, over the time I have been here, I have seen more division than unity. Much of the division in our society has permeated Trinity. In many ways, I feel I have been a flash point for these divisions. I know many have disagreed with my stance politically, socially, and regarding LGBTQ issues. I know many disagreed with suspending services and reopening during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic. The gaps became more evident during that time. The fact that the divisions at Trinity have widened during my time has been extremely painful.

My heart breaks at the thought of Trinity dying. This will be the outcome unless we put aside our differences and focus on God's mission for Trinity. A house divided against itself will fall. Have we reached the point that our opinions and dogmas are more important than the continuing life of Trinity? Kay and I joined Trinty when we moved in 1986 because we felt the closeness of the community. Now it seems that opinions and dogmas are more important than the community.

The years after 1865 were a time of painful healing for the United States. But the country thrived as people let go of the old way of life and put aside animosity. The North and the South united to form the nation we are today. We would not be the nation we are today without unity.

I am leaving Trinity at the end of this month and Darlene Kelly will be the new pastor. Some will disagree with her as much as you disagreed with me. I pray that you will put aside these differences of opinion. The church is people coming together and working in unity for the mission God has for the church. Trinity will thrive if we put aside our differences, and prayerfully discern God's mission.

Please get behind Darlene whether or not you agree with her. Be a church working in unity for God and the community so Trinity may live.
