Weco Biergarten, located at 626 Meeting St. in West Columbia, is a casual environment with a rotating list of beers, ciders, and sours on tap as well as bottled and canned beverages available to purchase, including wine. They post what's on tap on their website. They have a large variety to choose from, including non-alcoholic options like soda, sparkling water, kombucha, and local canned cold brew coffee. They offer mostly outdoor seating under a large covered patio and tables with umbrellas beyond the patio. Starting on Sunday, Dec. 1st and running the four Sundays of Advent, we'll join together right after church (we'll figure something out re: Taste of Trinity) for brunch and a seasonal, biblical journey!

Trinity shows up.....

I volunteered to talk about our Presence in the church, meaning us physically being at church. We, as Methodists, when joining the church, vow to uphold the church with our Presence, being physically here.

Some of you know how long I have been here, but some may not, so I am going to share my Trinity story. My 45 year relationship with Trinity started when I was about 9 or 10. We came here when I was in the 5th grade. We attended Sunday School, Big church, and MYF. I came faithfully until I started college and then did not come so regularly through college. But you see, I had Joe Alley at my college, so I kind of felt at home. After college, my roommate, Kelly, who is a faithful servant of Christ, started attending church in Lexington, but she was a Presbyterian. I couldn't change denominations, that's like changing religions. I started to miss being at church, so I visited Lexington UMC, but it did not feel like home. So, I came back to Trinity and I'm so glad I did. I started keeping the nursery and teaching Sunday School with Donna Easterling. I took a discipleship Bible class led by Dr. Bill Butler, he was also my Bible teacher at Columbia College. I served on committees, taught VBS, then led VBS, counted money every month with Ted Frady for years upon years, and continued teaching Sunday School when my daughter, Claire was little.

You could say I love SHOWING UP for Trinity.

In the book of Hebrews Chapter 10 the Bibles says ²⁴ "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, ²⁵ not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another". To me, those verses explain Trinity; we enjoy being in the presence of one another.

Being at Trinity for so long has given me a feeling that it is my duty to Trinity to SHOW UP, to give my TIME, but it's not <u>out of guilt</u>, it's out of love for all of you. I believe that all of you SHOW UP for Trinity out of love for her. I will paraphrase something I read online: it said physically attending church makes us part of something bigger than ourselves, makes us part of a community, and makes us PRESENT for each other.

AND Trinity people show up in small and big ways.......

We do this by SHOWING UP to teach Sunday School, to be an usher and to acolyte, to sing in the choir, to lead the choir, to read scripture during the service, and to sometimes preach. We SHOW UP to keep the nursery, to bake bread for communion, to prepare Time Together, to wash dishes after meals, and to lead and attend meetings. If we did not SHOW UP and give our time, there would be no church.

I remember this one church wide camping/glamping trip (we weren't in tents) the entire church went on and it was so much fun, because everyone SHOWED UP. We used to have weekend long planning retreats that we SHOWED UP for. The Fall Festival meant the men would spend the night cooking a pig for the BBQ the next day. They SHOWED UP and spent time together. We SHOW UP for Easter Egg hunts. Becky Derrick boiled eggs for every Easter Egg Hunt I have been a part of except for this year's hunt and that's been a lot of hunts. One of my favorites is SHOWING UP for our Christmas Eve service, singing the Hymns, and to see extended church family we have not seen in a while. We SHOW UP for baby showers and sadly for illnesses and funerals. I believe that is where Trinity shines.....when we really need one another. I experienced firsthand that PRESENCE from members when my father and sister passed away. The church needs us here to exist, to not give up meeting together, and to just be PRESENT for one another.

Coming back to Trinity after college sparked a strong bond with me and Trinity. Being present, SHOWING UP here is not a chore, it's not even a second thought. Donna Easterling once said about she and I leaving Trinity that "They will have to pry our cold dead hands off these pews".
